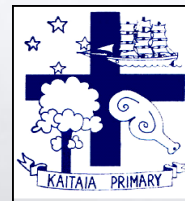

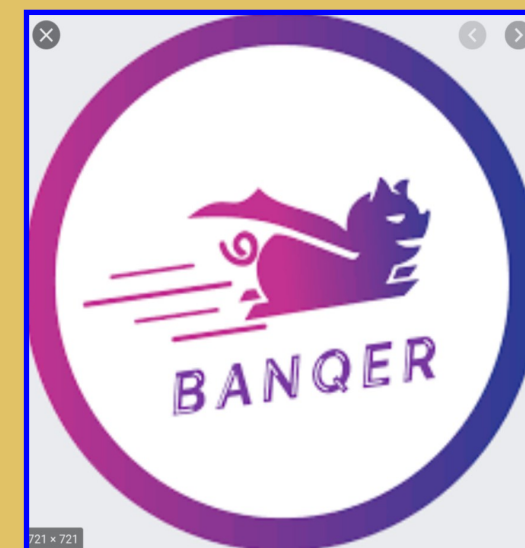

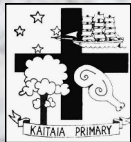
### SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 23:
