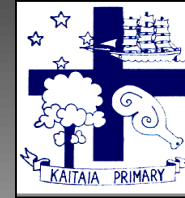

## Lift the Lip - free Dental checks

“Lift the Lip is a nation wide incentive to encourage checking for signs of dental decay in our tamariki and then arranging appropriate Dental Health Care for them based on their level of oral health.

Dental Health Promotion Kaimahi, Sonya Butters and Tehya Henare-Toka, from Te Hiku Hauora will be visiting our school to perform these checks with your permission.

They will note any visible signs of decay and help put you in touch with the right services to ensure your child receives any necessary treatment. The check requires no tool, is non-invasive, and takes less than 2 minutes. Please fill out and return your child’s permission form to make sure they don’t miss out!”

# SPORT SNACK IDEA

1-2 balls = 1 serving  
Recipe makes 12-15 balls

## Bliss Ball recipe

- 1 1/2 cups pitted dates
- 1/4 cup sunflower seeds
- 2 tbsp canola oil
- 2 tbsp cocoa powder
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup (45g) desiccated coconut, for rolling

Developed by Sport Waikato 2018

1. Place all the ingredients, apart from the coconut, into a food processor and whizz for 45 seconds.
2. Remove mixture from processor and empty into a bowl.
3. Scoop up handfuls of the mix, and roll into small balls. Then roll each ball through the coconut.
4. Serve immediately or store in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 10 days.
