

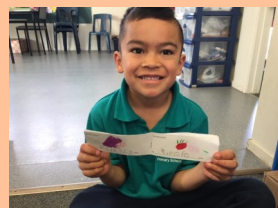


JUNIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 18:

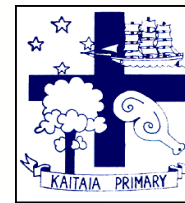

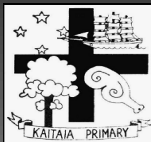


SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 13:

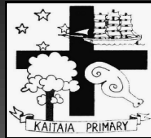

BANANA OAT COOKIES

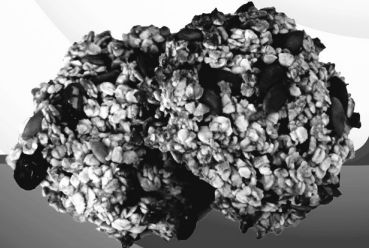


Got a bit more time to prep your snack? Try this cookie recipe!

Ingredients:

- 2 ripe bananas - mashed
- 1 ¾ cup rolled oats
- ½ cup of either cranberries, raisins, nuts or seeds

Pre-heat oven to 180 °C. Mash the bananas and combine with the other ingredients, mixing well. Place tablespoons of the mixture onto a lined baking tray and bake in the oven for 15-20 mins.
