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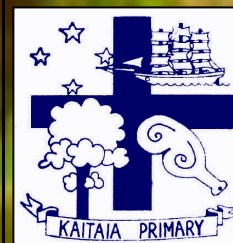
## SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 10:

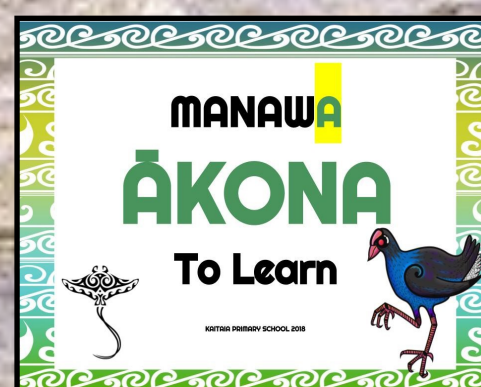

## MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS FROM ROOM 12:

Room 12 has been busy making eco-bricks (plastic bottles with compacted non-recyclable plastic waste) to use as 'bricks' to build a raised garden bed. We made our own cob and natural cement to encase the bricks using paper, sand, clay, manure and a small amount of cement. The total cost to build a garden is \$10!! Our project even made it into the newspaper 'Northland Age'. We used x100 eco-brick bottles which equates to x100 bags of rubbish that would have otherwise been buried in the landfill.
