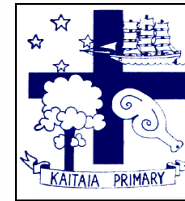

As always, I want to thank all parents/caregivers for your involvement in children's learning. Our children will always be more successful in their learning when home and school work as a team.

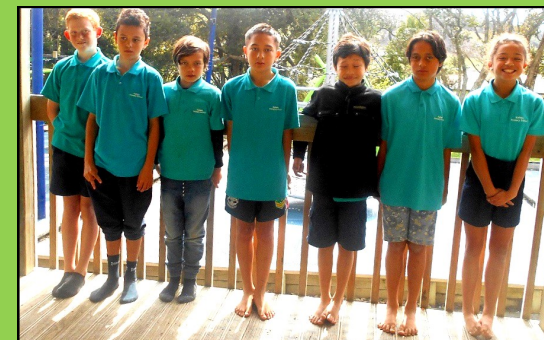

## SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 20:

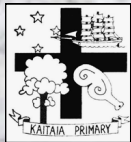

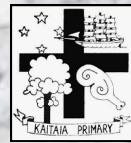
