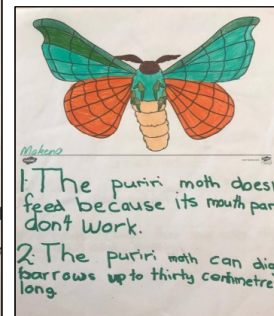
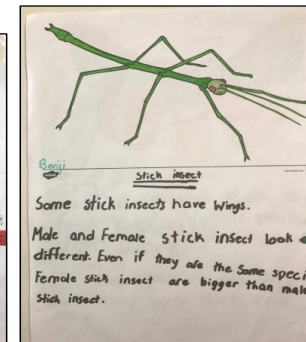
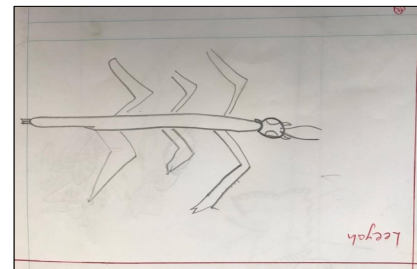

There have been some amazing camps again this year and I know there are a few more to come in Term 4. Well done teachers for organising all these experiences for our kids and whanau.

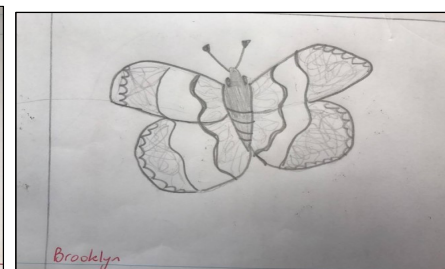

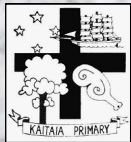
