

Special thanks from me to all our sideline parents who are there every Saturday to support our tamariki in their games, rain, hail or shine.






## SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 10:


**STARTING TIMES:** 11.00am Senior School Years 3-6.
