Yesterday saw a very significant event happen throughout New Zealand. For the first time in 24 years, Primary School Teachers and Principals went on strike so that their voice could be heard. The biggest problem schools are facing is the Teacher shortage. Many schools like ours have had to put Relief Teachers into classrooms because no applicants have applied for jobs advertised. With Relief Teachers now in class full time, we are short of Relief Teachers who come in when Teachers are sick or away at professional development courses.

The upshot of all this is that we have Senior staff like Deputy Principals, Assistant Principals and in some cases Principals themselves going back into classes. This means that their important work comes to a stand still. What is more commonly happening is that schools are having to split classes which adds extra numbers to several other rooms, affecting the learning of all the students there. Without enough teachers in NZ the reality for schools very soon will be to employ Teachers from overseas.

I thank everyone who tooted their support or marched with us yesterday here in Kaitaia and throughout our country. Something needs to be done! Ka kite, Brendon Morrissey
