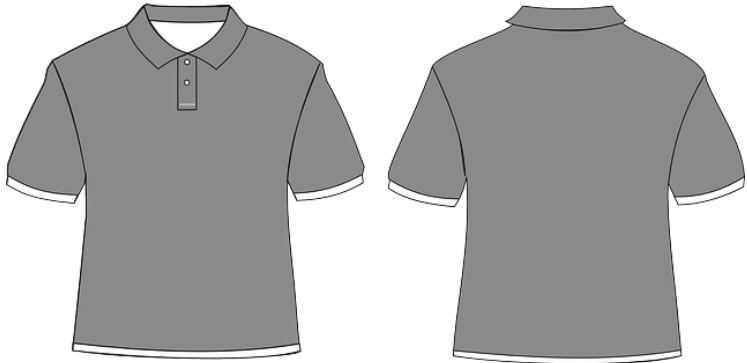
School Notices
