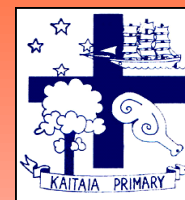

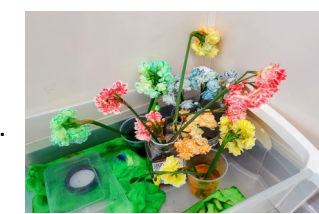

**JUNIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 4:**

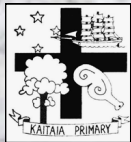
SUSTAINABILITY- In Term 2. Our children looked at the effect of rubbish in the oceans, on sea life and on land.

The children wondered if fish have noses. They discovered they do have noses but don't use them to breathe, instead getting their oxygen from the sea water through their gills. They wrote sentences showing their learning and made a colourful wall by adding stuffed fish they made.

TREES- We learnt about the importance of the Amazon Rainforest, and why we shouldn't cut natural forests down. Trees take in carbon dioxide and release oxygen for us to breathe. Aupouri forest is good because it grows renewable timber and provides jobs for our community.



Trees are an important part of the water cycle too. The process and direction of water movement was shown in our first experiment turning spring flowers blue. - Term 3 - Now we are learning about colours in the rainbow; mixing primary colours red, blue and yellow to make secondary colours green, orange and violet. 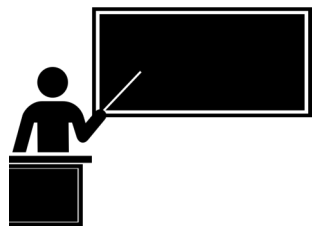
There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs. There just aren't enough teachers to give your kids the education they deserve.


