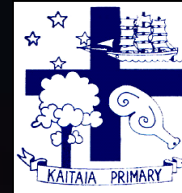

## JUNIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 2:

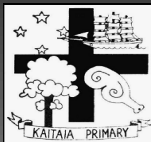
