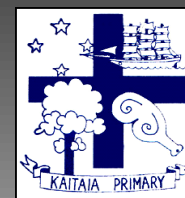

Room 3 have been learning about Sustainability. We learnt about what happens to our rubbish by visiting the recycling centre.

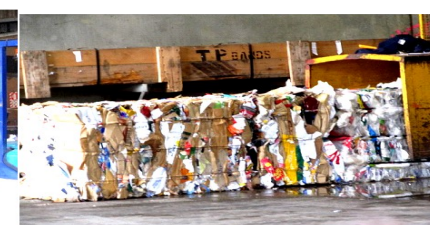
We found out that we can recycle lots of different materials, such as glass, plastic, cardboard, cans and paper.

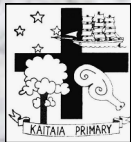
