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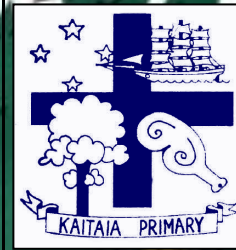
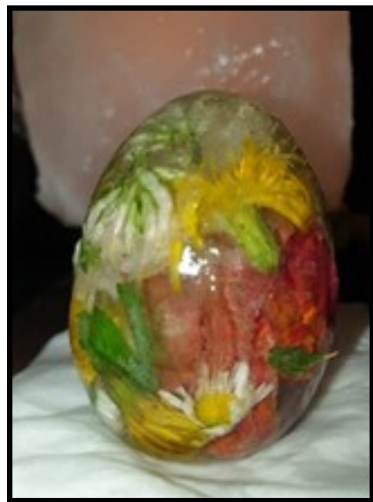
## SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 15B:

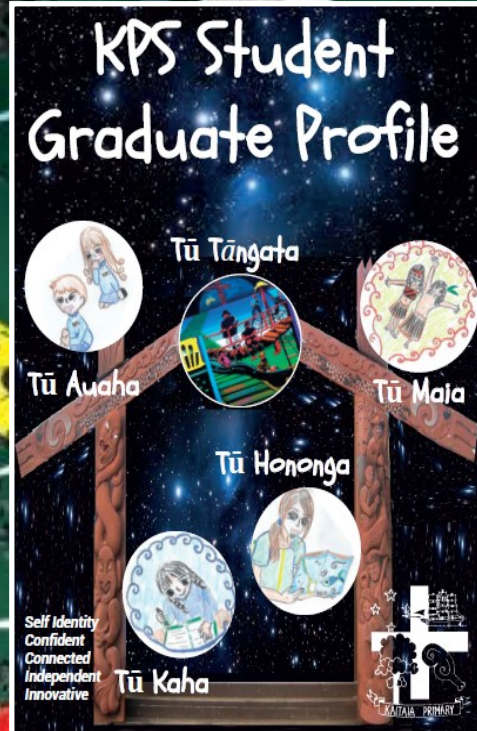
Kia ora koutou!

They are aware that some whanau have real concerns still and may be keeping their tamariki away from school for a while. The MOE has instructed schools to mark those children as absent unless a medical certificate/reason is provided to say that they should work from home for a while longer. The medical certificate may be for a member of the household who has health issues and needs to be kept safe at this time. The 20 day absentee rule still applies to schools and a student will come off our school roll unless a medical certificate has been supplied to our office. Sorry whanau but those are the rules we have to follow at this time.

A number of chromebooks have been sent out to students during the lockdown period recently. Now that we are back at school, the chromebooks need to be brought in to our school office. We are checking them off each day and as they come in our students are able to see me for a prize from my prize-box. These chromebooks belong to our school and will be used by our tamariki at school. If we go back into lockdown again, I have a list of students they will be able to go to so they can access learning online. Our teachers will continue to add some learning activities to their class pages over the upcoming weeks.

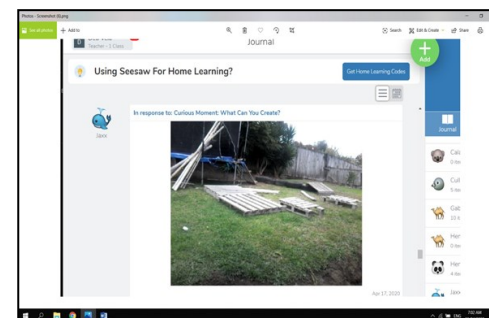
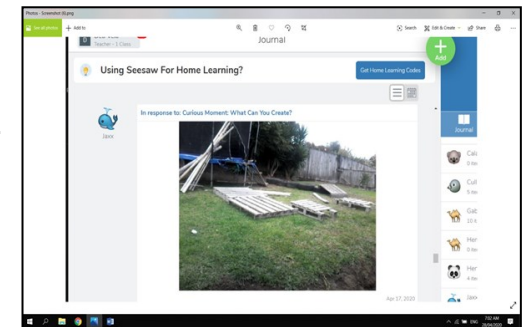


## JUNIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 6:

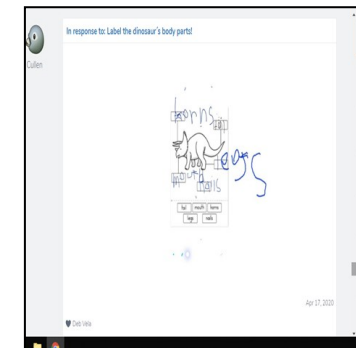
Kia ora Koutou!

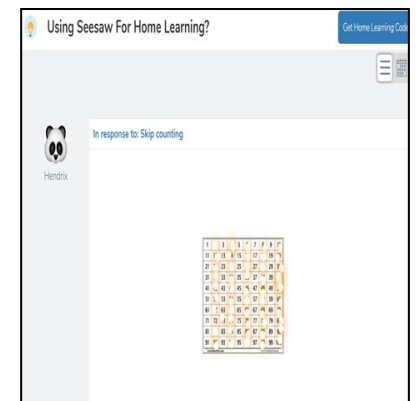

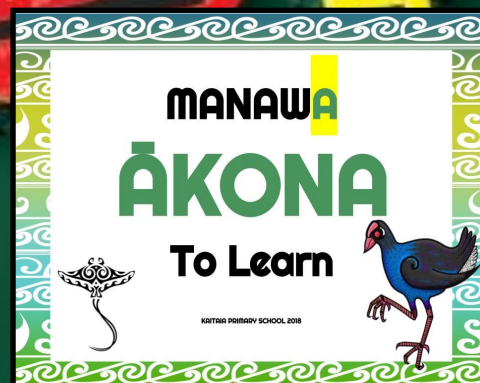
Jaxx and his whanau created this amazing circuit – Looks like a lot of fun!



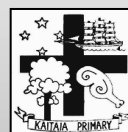
I like how you labelled your dinosaur Cullen
