We decided to make some paper plate Baby Bears.



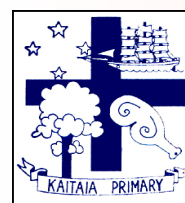

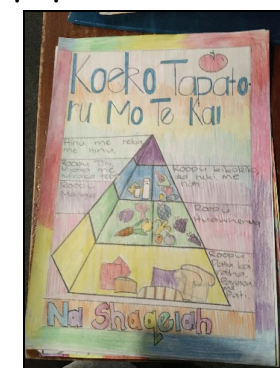
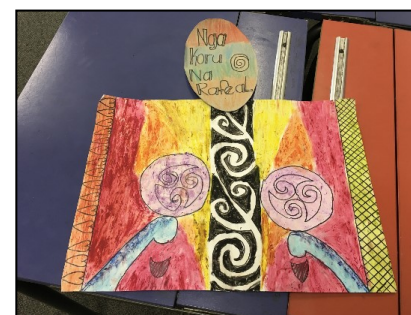


SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 19:
