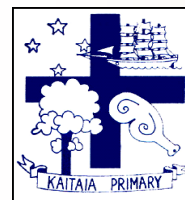

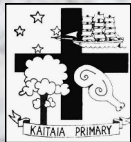

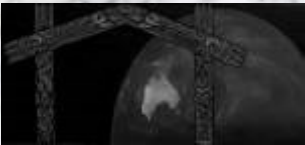
**MIDDLE SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 11:**
