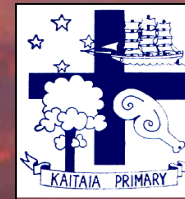

In particular, we are talking about Measles which is spreading throughout NZ as we speak. Best advice we can give is to ensure your child/children are fully immunized. If they are not, there will be Drop-in Clinics held at the Kaitaia Hospital Whare on Thursdays starting on Thursday 19th September (NOW!)

Our school approach for cases of Measles, Impetigo and bad cases of Headlice will be to contact parents/caregivers so children can be taken home for the appropriate and necessary treatment they require.

TENNIS COACHING IN TERM 4

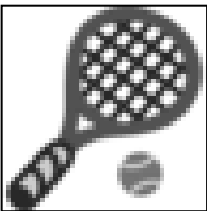
Tennis coaching is being offered in Term 1 and Term 4 to children aged 6 years to 18 years.
