Room 8 had so much fun trying new things this week! We decorated fun pink cookies for Pink Shirt day and talked about the importance of being kind and showing aroha to everyone.

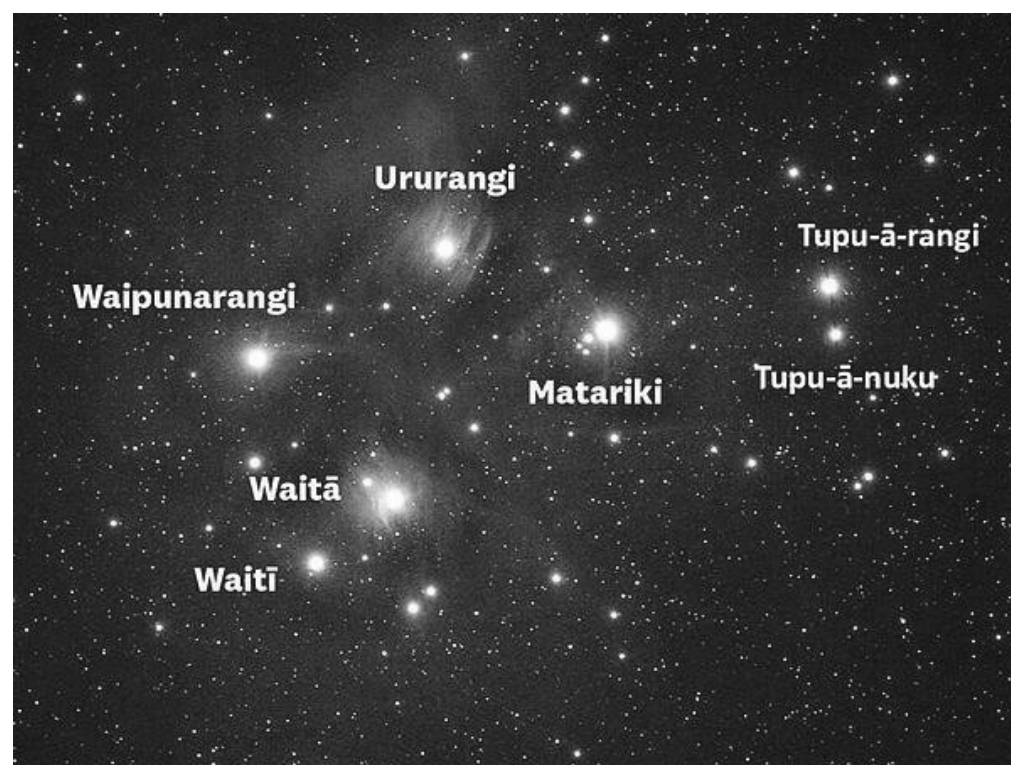
