This is part of the personal safety programme **Keeping Ourselves** Safe.

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been designed to give children the skills to cope in situations involving abuse. It has 3 overall aims:

To develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people.

To support and encourage abused children to get help from caring adults.

To make teachers and parents/caregivers more aware of the need to keep children safe from abuse by adults or other children.

To be successful Keeping Ourselves Safe needs your help and support. Your child will have Home Book Activities to work on with you.

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning.

This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child use his or her new skills with confidence.
