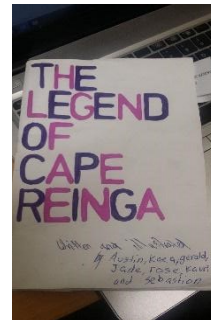

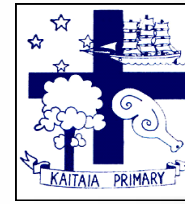

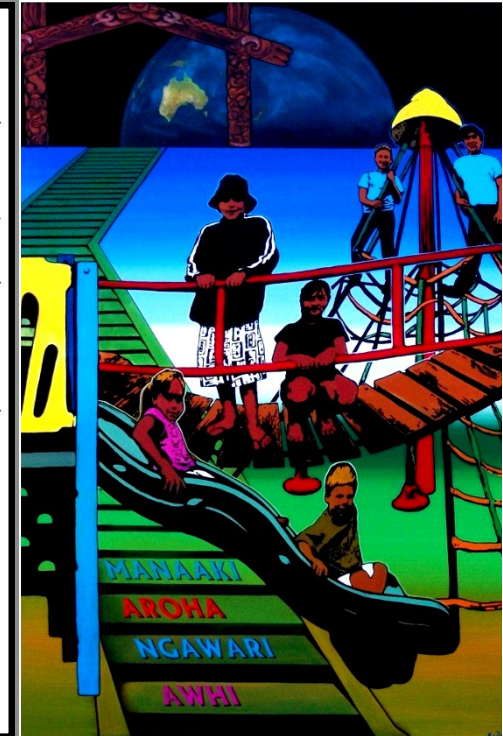
Kia ora koutou!

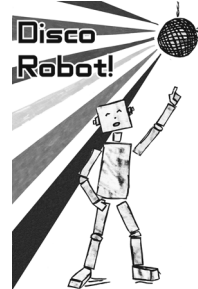
