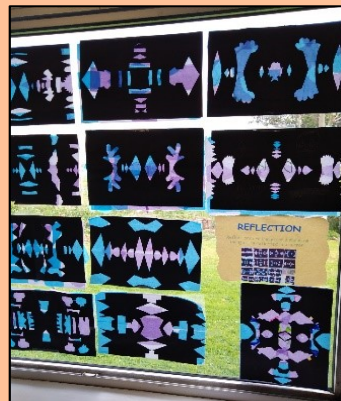


**SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 11:**

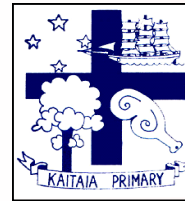

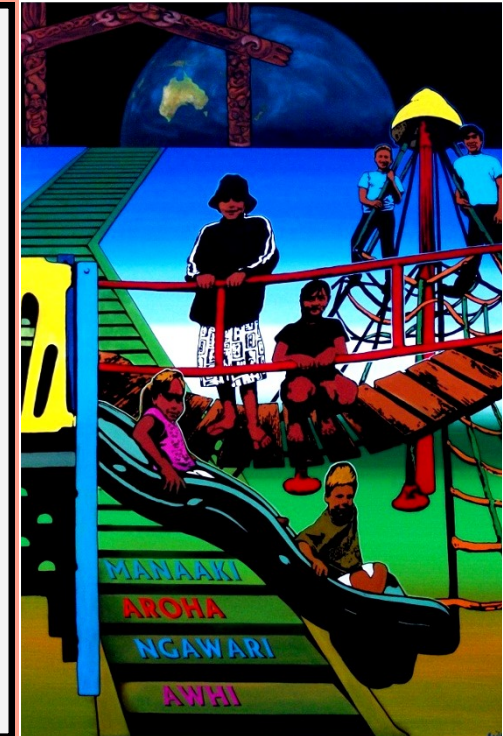
Kia ora koutou!

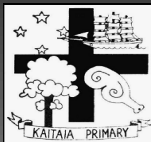
