I'm on the right track

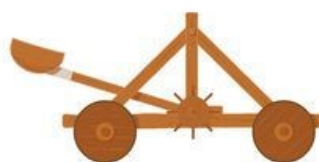
fixed mindset

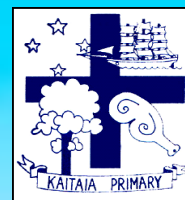

ROOM 5

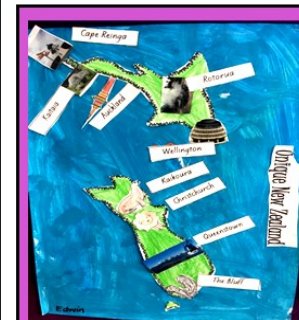
