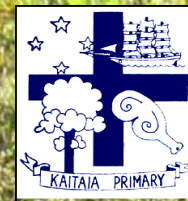

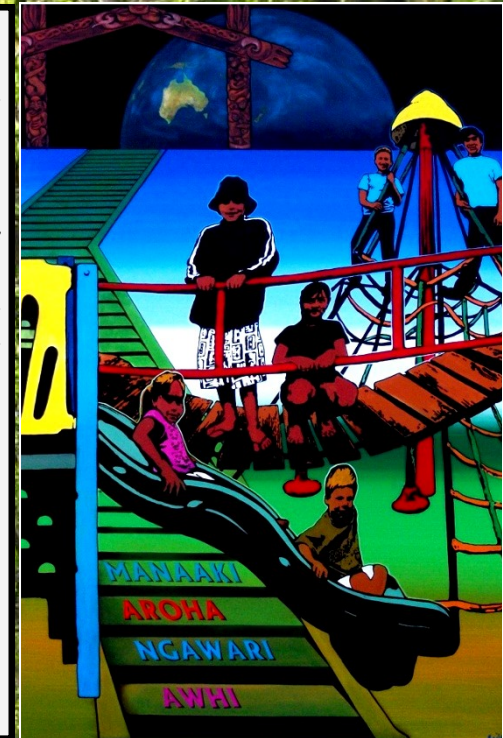
Kia ora koutou!

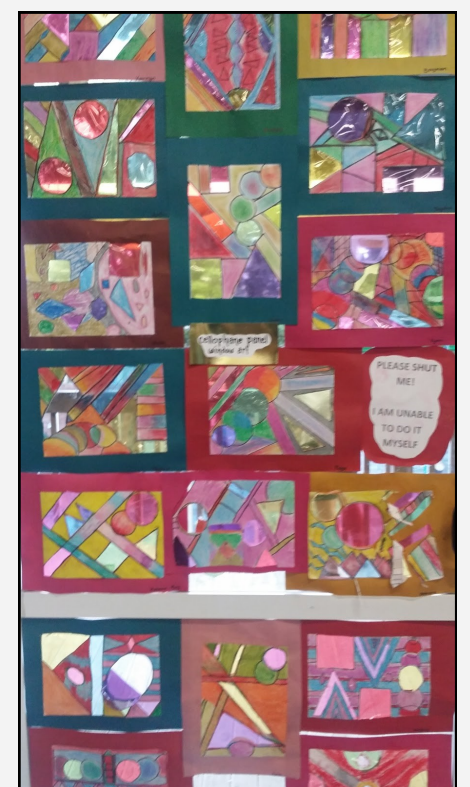

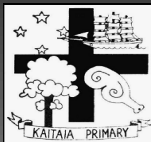
