In fitness we have had lots of fun skipping.

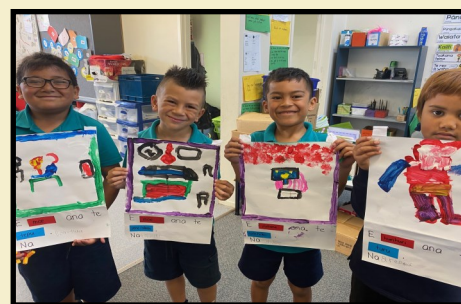

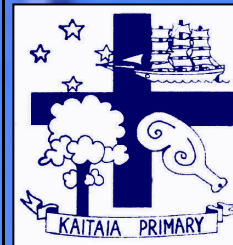

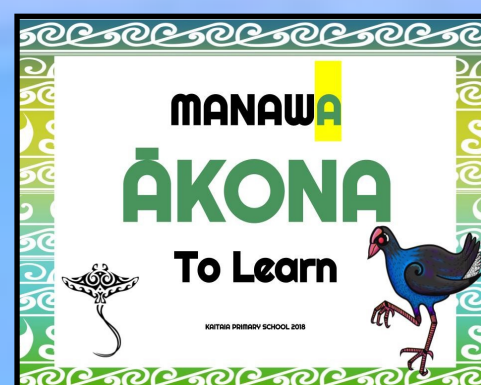


### What's happening in Room 19

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child use his or her new skills with confidence.

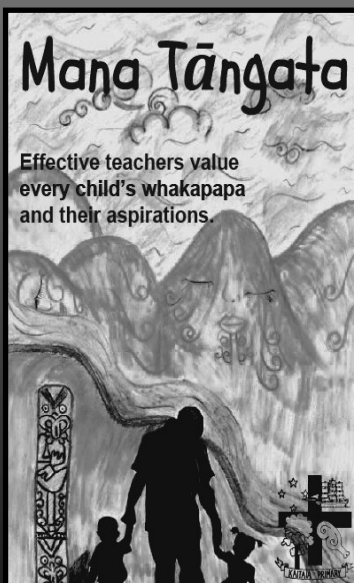
## SCHOOL UNIFORM
