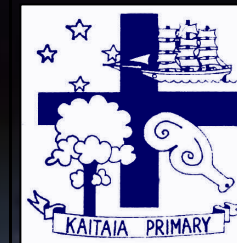


SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS: from Room 9:

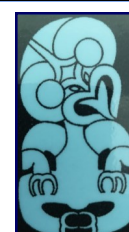
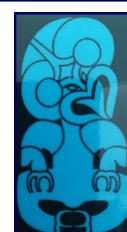
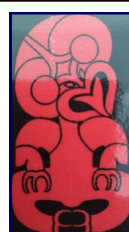
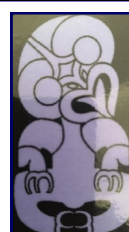
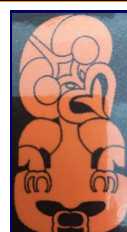
We LOVED taking a trip to the Te Ahu centre and to our local childcare centres.

All of our students in Study Centre are given extra tuition from trained teachers (Mr M, Mrs T from Room 9 and Matua Corey) in Handwriting, Spelling, Reading Comprehension and Times Tables in Maths.
