

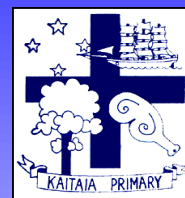
**JUNIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 6:**

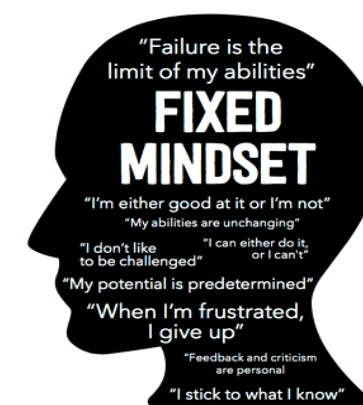
**SENIOR SYNDICATE NEWS FROM ROOM 14:**
