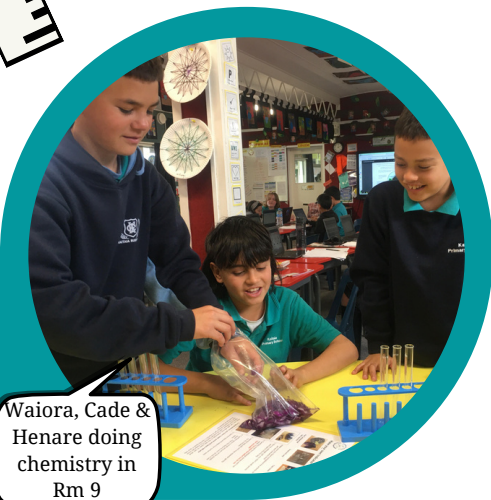
Reminders

Wow!! Rm 2 has had a super busy time this term. Last week we celebrated Te Wiki o te Reo Maori by reading 'Poaka Kunekune' and doing some activities. We labeled different parts of 'Te Pamu' (the farm) and grouped and classified kai as reka (delicious) or kawa (sour). During reading and writing we have been learning to retell stories to show if we understand the stories we read and we have been using time words (first, then & last) to write simple instructions. Next on our learning journey is to understand about states of matter (solid, liquid and gas).
